FAREWELL TO THE GLENCOE HALL

The Glencoe Community Hall was originally the Glencoe School, and served the communities of St. Paul's, Glencoe and Iron Rock between 1938 and the early 1970's, when it was deemed surplus and sold to the Glencoe Community Hall Association through the

Little Red Schoolhouse program.

The current building was built by Archie Thompson sometime after 1938, when the previous Schoolhouse burned down. It was the 4th schoolhouse, with all of the previous buildings being lost to fire. The original school burned down in 1874. Replacements were built in

1875, 1909 and then finally, the current building after 1938. The Glencoe Community Hall played an active roll in the community for many years, hosting dances and card parties, kitchen parties or ceilidhs, Cub Scouts, 4H meetings and weddings.

Sadly, over the past few years, the hall sustained damage to the

of the building. The association applied for funding to repair the roof earlier this year, but learned that major renovations would be required to bring the building up to code and allow it to be used to host community events going forward. The price tag for the upgrades would be well over \$150,000.00. With 3 other renovated and fully accessible halls available in the area (Springville Church and Community Hall, Bridgeville Community Hall and the MacDonald Rebekah Lodge in Sunnybrae), it was impossible to justify that level of investment. Especially as the number of events at the hall has dwindled over the years making it increasingly difficult to generate income to support the ongoing

upkeep of the building.

It was determined that the most prudent course of action was to have the hall demolished, to avoid a slow and inevitable deterioration. It is with very heavy hearts that this decision has been made, and we recognize the deep emotional attachment many people in the area have for the hall. We intend to fundraise and build a commemorative gazebo to be placed in the spot where the hall stood, and will continue to host the annual Remembrance Day Service at the Cenotaph across the road every November 11th.

Arrangements are currently being made to donate or sell any reusable elements of the building including the windows, prior to scheduling the demolition. If anyone is interested in salvaging any materials from the building, please contact Cathy Hay at 902-923-2222. A meeting will be held on Monday, August 19 at 7pm at the hall to present a new Memorandum of Association and Bylaws to reflect the revised purpose of the Association, which will focus on maintaining the property and Cenotaph and planning and conducting the annual Remembrance Day Service.

- 1/2 Cup white sugar
- 2 Eggs
- · 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 1/4 Cups Flour
- · 1/2 teaspoon Baking Soda
- · 1 teaspoon salt
- · 3 Cups Quick Oats
- 1 Cup Choc Chips

Directions:

- PreHeat oven 350
- · In a large bowl, cream together the butter, brown sugar, and white sugar until smooth. Beat in eggs 1 at a time, then stir in vanilla.
- · Combine the flour, baking soda, and salt;
- · Stir into the creamed mixture until just blended.
- · Mix in the guick oats, choc chips.
- · Drop by heaping spoonfuls onto a greased baking sheet.
- · Bake for 12 minutes in the preheated oven. Allow to cool on a baking sheet 5 minutes before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.
